



Emergency Procedure

- In the event of fire at home, our escape route would be straight out the front door. (Or the back door if the front is blocked by fire) We would then wait in the front of one of the neighbours houses, or use the car to escape if necessary.
- My mobile phone is on me at all times, and contains parent contact details. My husband also holds a copy of parent contact numbers, and my assistants hold a copy whilst working.
- I would use my phone to contact parents for each of the children in my care, to arrange for their safe collection.
- I and my assistants would continue to care for your children, reassuring them, until they are able to be collected.
- In the event of a serious injury to myself, an assistant or any of the children in my care, an ambulance would be called. We would then contact parents/carers to collect their children, as well as calling in extra adult help (see below). If time allowed, we would leave children at my house with adult supervision. Otherwise, I would take children with me to hospital and advise their parents where to collect them from.
- I would always accompany any child who needed to be taken to hospital.
- I have childminding assistants and I also know several local registered childminders, any of whom could care for your child, if I was suddenly incapacitated, until you are able to pick them up.
- I require you to sign giving permission for me and my assistants to seek emergency treatment for your child. e.g. to call an ambulance.
- Even in an emergency, we cannot give permission for medical treatment of a child in my care. However, in a “life threatening” situation medical staff would give any necessary treatment.
